## Invitation for Employment

Dear Dartmouth College Snowsports Instructor,

As a skier who has made a career out of snowsports instruction, we already have in common teaching at the Dartmouth Skiway, where I got my start. Now, 25 years later, having grown with the sport, and risen through its ranks, I would like to extend an invitation for Level I certified instructors to apply to teach at Snow King Mountain Resort in Jackson, Wyoming. Directed for 37 years by Bill Briggs, D '54, and first to ski the nearby Grand Teton, Snow King's Mountain Sports School, now in its 73<sup>rd</sup> year, has a long and storied history.

Snow King itself overlooks the town of Jackson, Wyoming, and has been a training ground for some of Jackson's leading skiers, racer, mountaineers and athletes. Snowmaking augments the natural snowfall of about 250-300 inches annually, ensuring a great training surface for the Jackson Hole Ski Club. Acre for acre, Snow King is the steepest area in the country. As we say, "If you can ski the King, you can ski anywhere."

The Snow King Mountain Sports School offers Alpine, Snowboard, Telemark and Cross Country lessons, and we value the ability to teach more than one discipline. In fact, more and more, cross-discipline teaching ability is becoming the norm rather than the exception, though we will still hire instructors who have experience in only one discipline.

We have extensive training for new and returning instructors that begins on or before Snow King's Opening Day, and a break before the height of business, which starts on December 26. Applicants should plan to be available to train between December 10 and 20, and can plan to go home for the holidays, if willing to be back for work starting December 27. Training is also available throughout the season, to support and encourage PSIA and AASI education and certification, which is also (immediately) rewarded in our pay scale.

To apply, please send a resume, references and a cover letter by November 1, including your aspirations for snowsports, instruction, and certification.

We hope you'll consider this opportunity to grow your understanding of the sport, and to take what you've learned at the DRSS and apply it in a new setting. We hope to help you take the next step in a career in snowsports instruction.
